Home Occupation Class 2 Permits

There has been some misinformation going around so here is the scoop!

On August 23, 2022, the Board of Douglas County Commissioners adopted amendments to the County's Home Occupation 2 Permits. These permits allow homeowners on parcels 4.5 acres or greater in a rural residential areas to operate specific type of home businesses in unincorporated Douglas County.

Surrey Ridge Estates has covenants which prohibits anything other than residential use. The updated county amendment requires the HOA, or, if an inactive HOA, then the adjacent homeowners, to be notified in writing prior to a permit being applied for. The permit does not exempt the property owner from complying with a homeowners' association's covenants, architectural standards, or other requirements, and the county staff also conducts annual inspections to verify County regulations are adhered to.
